At our annual meeting in January, we elected three new members to the ongoing adventure we call the Bishop's Committee. My thanks to Donna O'Leary, Pat Lakeman, and John Drumm for stepping forward.

The Bishop's Committee is the body that makes decisions for St. Germain's. The mission of the Bishop's Committee is basically two things: to take care of the property and finances, and to discern God's call for the congregation. That's a tall order.

Each member of the Bishop's Committee serves for a three-year term, after which they must drop back for a year before running for election again. The Bishop's Committee meets once a month, usually in the middle of the day.

One of the good things about serving on the BC is that you really get to see what's going on in the church. The BC reviews our financial report monthly, makes plans for events, and grapples with any new challenges that arise. You never know what might come up at a BC meeting!

Another good thing about serving on the BC is that you see the wisdom of the church at work. Somehow we always come up with creative answers to knotty problems. We're a team.

We always begin our BC meetings with a short Bible study. I think it helps us remember that we're doing God's work. We're not just another non-profit board trying to balance the budget, we're on a mission from God!

I believe that leadership is what makes the difference in every organization. When you have good leadership, the organization thrives. Leaders set the tone for the organization. The attitude of the leaders becomes the attitude of the congregation. I've always found our BC meetings to be positive and creative.

I hope you'll support and encourage our BC members as they do their work in the coming year. And if you're ever asked to run for the Bishop's Committee, I hope you'll say yes.

Confirmation is one of the sacraments in the Episcopal Church. The Book of Common Prayer says that "in the course of their Christian development, those baptized at an early age are expected, when they are ready and have been duly prepared, to make a mature public affirmation of their faith and commitment to the responsibilities of their Baptism and to receive the laying on of hands by the bishop." Confirmation gives us the opportunity to learn about and then avow

our faith, more fully comprehending the teachings and beliefs of the Episcopal tradition. It serves as a formal recognition of belonging and connection to this faith community. Contact Fr. Bill if you are interested.

You are invited to participate in the Diocesan Confirmation Series for Adults, a weekly Episcopal education series for those who would like to know more about the church and are seeking to better understand the tenets of this faith tradition. Starting on Sunday, February 23rd, we'll meet weekly via Zoom and for each session you will get to know and hear from a different "teacher." We've invited a cross-section of clergy, lay leaders and even our Bishop to join us and share about the aspects of faith that mean the most to them. Our hope is that you get a sense of both the long-held traditions and the diverse perspectives which make the Episcopal faith rich and dynamic.

- April 27: Session 8 with Bishop Phil LaBelle Saturday, May 3: Cathedral Day, Saint Mark's Cathedral


Topics will include:

At the end of the series you will have the option to be confirmed or received at <u>Cathedral Day</u>, May 3, 2025 at Saint Mark's Cathedral, Seattle, an annual tradition in the Diocese of Olympia. Also, Bishop Sean Rowe will be visiting St. Germain's on July 20th and will confirm that day as well. We also ask that you choose a sponsor. This could be someone from your church, a family friend, or a clergy member, who will help uphold and support you in your journey to confirmation/reception and beyond.
